Deana has been teaching kids of all ages to knit for the past several years at Lawton with her daughter, Emma, who just graduated from Lawton and is now a 6<sup>th</sup> grader at McClure Middle School. Deana's youngest daughter, Simone, is in first grade. Lisa joined the knitting team at Lawton last year and is looking forward to another fun year of teaching kids to knit. During the first session, kids will create their own handmade knitting needles using wooden dowels, sand paper, wax and clay ends. In the following sessions, students will get an opportunity to pick out their yarn and get started on their projects.
